Welcoming Guests: A great deal of research has shown that when someone visits a spiritual community, they desire to be anonymous the first time or two. They are "church shopping" and want to slip in and out undetected. Our current method of giving flowers and Welcome Packs may, therefore, actually be making some uncomfortable. When we *all* fill out a card each week, the newcomer does not feel singled out. This allows us to follow up with first-time guests in a comfortable and non-threatening way.


We Care: Recently, I was speaking with a woman who had not been here for a month because she was ill. I'm sad to admit that I had no idea she was under the weather. Thanks to the **FUSION** process, our newly formed "We Care" ministry will receive notice whenever someone misses three consecutive weeks of service so they can offer help and support if the person is experiencing a life challenge.

Growth Requires Commitment: It would be nice if we could grow spiritually without any effort on our part but such is not the case. So, each week everyone who attends service will be asked to make a commitment to take some action step along their journey. It may be to repeat an affirmation, spend extra time in prayer or any of a number of spiritual practices to encourage one to grow in Spirit.

Keeping Accurate Records: Approximately one in four people move in any given year. Every time we send out a piece of mail to the wrong address, it costs us extra postage. By everyone filling out weekly **FUSION** cards, we will be able to keep our records up to date and reduce expenses.

Unity's 2010 World Day of Prayer: "Living in the Flow"

It was seventeen years ago when Unity created the first World Day of Prayer. It was created to foster a universal experience of peace and harmony through prayer for everyone in the world. Traditionally, World Day of

Prayer is held on the second Thursday in September and it is celebrated in Unity churches and spiritual centers everywhere throughout the world.

Last year there were approximately a million people who were prayed for during this event. I imagine that this year the number of those prayed for will grow, for human beings everywhere are becoming increasingly conscious of the spiritual power and blessings inherent through prayer. Prayer is our conscious, intentional communion in and with God, and just as it is an incredible blessing to be prayed for, we also know that it is just as wonderful to pray for others. Prayer is a blessing for all.

The inspiring poet and mystic Rumi has written,

"Open the window in the center of your chest--- and let Spirit fly in and out."

Through these simple but profound words I am reminded of how the experience of prayer can feel for all of us. When we pray we can open our hearts wide to experience God's presence, for it flows in and through us and cycles back into the world as an endless movement of blessings. Unity's theme for this year's World Day of Prayer, "Living in the Flow," reflects this awareness of movement beautifully, and my hope is that all of us here will experience a deepening in our spiritual understanding of how this is so.

Please join with us on Thursday, September 9th, as we celebrate World Day of Prayer at One Community Spiritual Center! You can:

~ *Write out prayer flags (which are prayerful affirmations and names written on strips of cloth) which will be hung outside to allow our prayers to blow in the wind across the world.* Prayer flags are used in other traditions as well as a way of sharing prayers with others throughout the world.

~ *Fill out the special prayer request lists with names of all those you want held in prayer.* We'll send them to Silent Unity, (Unity's prayer ministry), where those you list will be prayed for continuously for another 30 days.

~ *Carpool with us to Unity Village to attend their special 11:00 prayer service.*

~ *Attend our own sacred 7 p.m. World Day of Prayer service.* The chaplains and I create this special time for all of us, and we'll have a special musical guest as well.

Let's choose to live in the endless flow of God's love and blessings, even more than ever before. Let's do it for ourselves, let's do it for each other, and let's do it for the world.

A Note from Your Board of Trustees President . . .

The Dalai Lama tells us in his book *“The Art of Happiness in a Troubled World”* that we are “all the same.” Within each human being there exists a spiritual presence, basic and diverse needs, and a wide range of feelings. As Rev. Will has mentioned in his recent lessons, we have difficulties with each other because our brain still has the primitive urge to watch out for potential threats and attack if necessary. If I sense my needs can only be fulfilled at the exclusion of yours, I become defensive and possibly aggressive. When we have problems with someone, they seem to intensify even more if we perceive that person to be “different” than ourselves – thus the evolution of prejudice.

This whole process played out in my life recently. An individual, different from myself, said something to me that I perceived as hateful and hurtful. My immediately response was to shut down into a seething silence. Our needs and feelings were in direct conflict with each other, so I thought, and I could only see our differences – he was a jerk and I was not. In retrospect, I now realize we could have described our needs and feelings and negotiated something that worked for both of us. This conversation could have focused on our sameness as many of our needs and feelings were indeed similar – love, understanding, and appreciation. As Rev. Myra is teaching, I could have seen the “God in him” and responded in a caring way.

The lesson here for me is to allow Spirit to help me look into another’s heart and recognize our sameness, celebrate our differences, and live in peace. The God in each of us empowers us as spiritual beings to transcend strife and embrace compassion. Next time I believe I will attempt to handle such an interaction out of my heart.

Because of our oneness, so it is and will always be.

Our youth programs are growing! When Lily Berkley joined One Community as Youth Director 5 years ago we had about 30 kids attending each Sunday and no teens at all! Now, during most typical Sundays we have around 75 children and teens in attendance at One Community. Most of you probably don’t know that we have 6 classes and the nursery running each Sunday. And new this fall we are adding a 7th classroom for the 2nd grade! It takes 30 trained teachers to pull off our Sunday school programs and countless volunteers throughout the week!

All teachers complete an application, an interview with youth director Lily Berkley, and a 2 hour training. Lily writes all the curriculum, prepares all supplies, and trains you. As a teacher you get to show up, see the highest in our children, and have fun! A teacher commits to be present in the classroom only twice a month – it is a wonderful way to learn and grow spiritually!

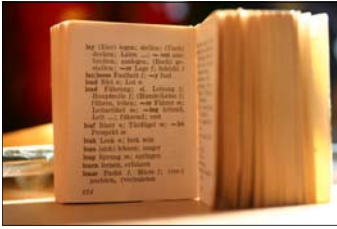
